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# Hurricane Season Travel Tips

The hurricane season occurs from early June to late November. Mexico, Central America, the Caribbean, and the east and Gulf coasts of the United States are the most threatened areas. Catastrophic storms can cause extreme damage to infrastructure, cutting off access to transportation, emergency assistance, medical care, and food and water. The ability of consular officials to assist Canadian citizens may be limited in such circumstances.

If you plan to travel during hurricane season, we encourage you to:

- **Check our Travel Advice and Advisories at [travel.gc.ca/advice](#)** to see if it is safe to travel to your destination.
- **Confirm travel arrangements** prior to departure and ensure that your **travel insurance** allows for trip cancellation or interruption in the event of a hurricane.
- **Ensure that detailed information is left with family or friends in Canada**, including the name of the tour operator, flight details, hotel name, location, room number and telephone numbers, cruise ship details and itineraries.
- **Ensure that emergency contact information is provided on page 4 of your passport** and leave copies of all travel documents with someone in Canada.
- **Sign up for the Registration of Canadians Abroad service ([travel.gc.ca/register](#))**, so that we can contact and assist you in case of an emergency.
- **Monitor local news broadcasts and weather reports carefully**, follow the advice of local authorities and tour

operators and know how to contact the nearest Canadian government office ([travel.gc.ca/offices](#)).

- **Obtain up-to-date weather forecasts** for the region from the National Hurricane Center at [www.nhc.noaa.gov](#).
- **Visit the website of the Canadian Hurricane Centre ([ec.gc.ca/ouragans-hurricanes](#))** for recommendations on hurricane preparedness.
- **Carry contact details for our Emergency Watch and Response Centre**, which operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and accepts collect calls (where available) from Canadians requiring assistance abroad (tel.: **613-996-8885**, email: [sos@international.gc.ca](#)).
